### Q Is there a way to make pearls more hip?

**A** The classic look has undergone a funkification as Hollywood style-setters start a string of strand trends. "There are endless ways to do pearls in a sexy, modern fashion," notes celebrity stylist Danna Weiss. "Just mix and match single or multiple strands, or different colors and sizes."

A long rope of pearls is the most versatile style; look for a lengthy set of

faux pearls at flea markets. "Take a long strand, wrap it around the neck a few times, and let the rest dangle," suggests Weiss. "Tie them into a belt on a simple black dress, or hang a vintage brooch or pretty pendant off the necklace."

For a simple but "way cool" look, Maggie Gyllenhaal lets a chunky strand hang down to her navel. (But be careful: If you use more than three strings at a time, you'll risk being swallowed up in pearls.)

### Q How can eye makeup go from day to night?

**A** No need to rinse off — just apply new makeup straight over the day look, notes makeup artist-to-the-stars Vincent Longo. He applies a black or charcoal eyeliner along the upper lash line, then

sweeps a smoky color across the lower lash line. For maximum drama, he lines the inner rim of the lower lash line with a black pencil. Finally, he dusts a shimmery nude shadow over the upper lids and then adds a few coats of mascara.
